Coaches Clifton and McIntyre are to be commended for their fine work this year.

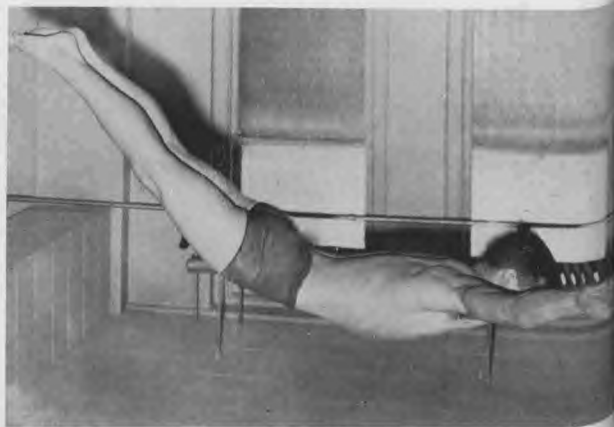

Four seniors—Jim Lawless, Wallace Arringdale, Tom Reed, and Jim Miller—were on the team this year.

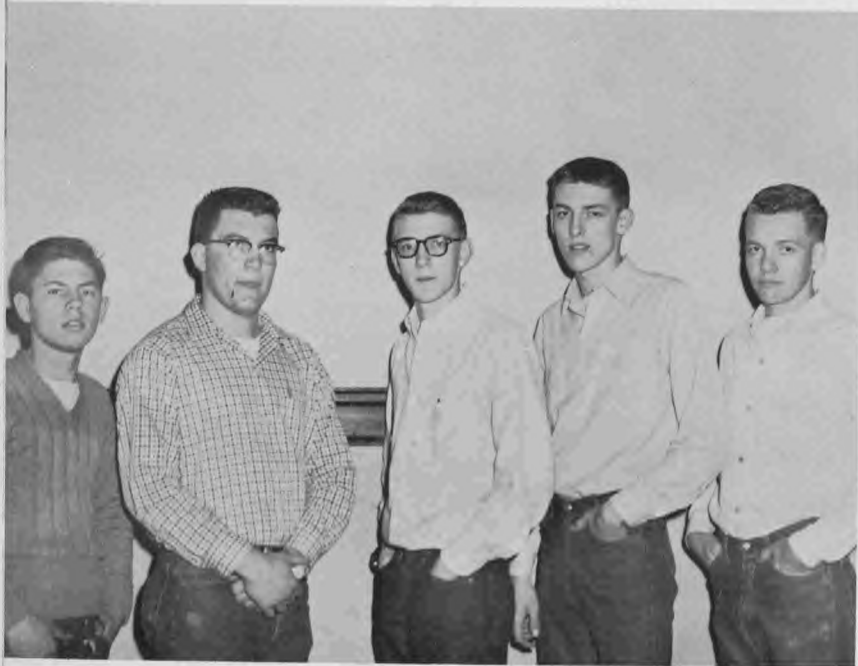
Wally Arringdale and Tony Williams were the top divers this year. Dave Nelson and Tom Reed accumulated the greatest number of points.

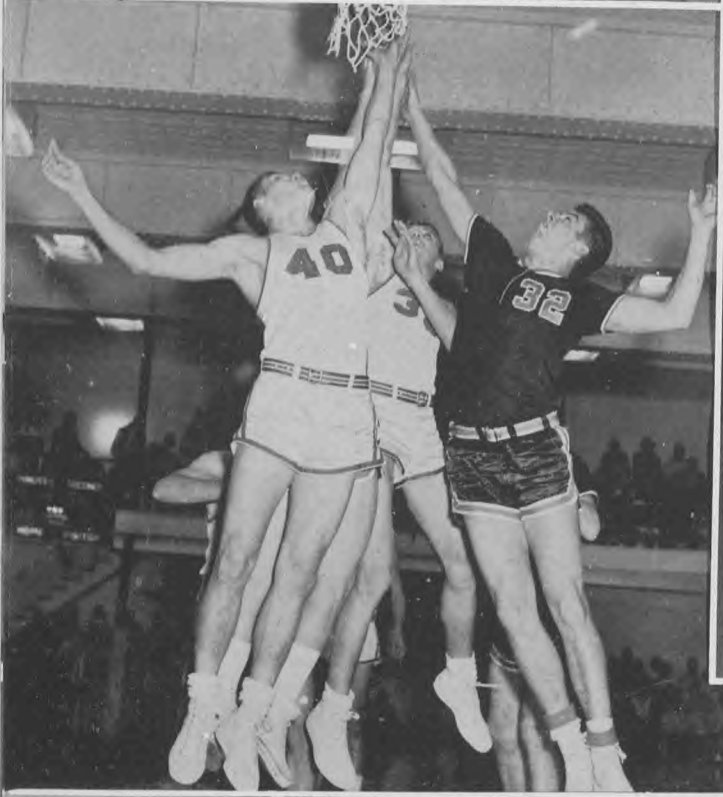
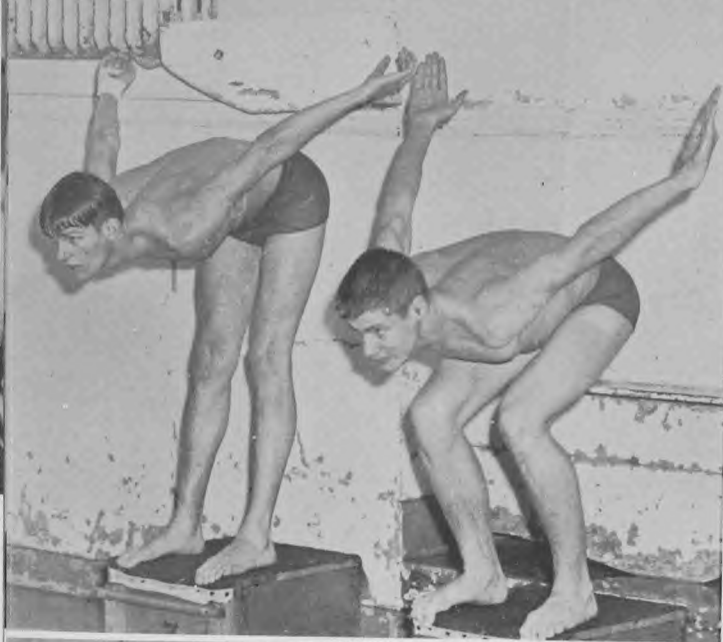
