Peggy Arnold will again be the editor of the newsletter.

The Society received several donations to the expanding collections of materials. Some of them are: Laura M. Beattie of Mt. Pleasant donated her family genealogy, Ward-Kelly; Peterson's Story of Iowa, four vol. set, from Elma Fenton and Donna Lee Martin; and Rosa Tisdale of Ames donated "Meet the Tisdales". They welcome any dona-

tions that would help other genealogists and historians in Davis County.

Archie Rupe presented the Bloomfield IOOF Cemetery records ready for publication. Several members had "read" the stones and Archie put the information on computer. It will be approximately 180 pp.

The January meeting will be Jan. 19 at 7 p.m. The Regional representative, Connie Dobert, of Ft. Madison, plans to attend the meeting as a visitor and would like some input on goals that area societies might accomplish in the coming months. Please plan to attend.

Genealogical Society has Feb. meeting

The Davis County Genealogical Society met Feb. 16, 1989, at the Public Library with 11 members and one guest, Connie Dobert, present. Connie is the Regional Representative for the Iowa Genealogical Society. On behalf of the Southeast Iowa Conference, she announced some of the plans for the Sept. 16, 1989 meeting in Fort Madison. An archivist from Kansas City will be a morning speaker. A meeting in April is tentatively planned on cemetery repair work with Paul Maddy. He started his work and talks after working at the Arlington National Cemetery. He had noted the damage caused by lawn mowers and decided it was necessary to see that stones were repaired correctly. A new name is being sought for the S. E. Iowa Conference to help eliminate confusion with another group. Two of the ones considered are Laplanders and Waubesaic Trail.

Letters on the Shewey (Shuey), Summerlin, and Stine families were received and information on these families is needed.

Jerry Green reported of the need for at least three rolls of microfilm to get the newspaper file updated. It should cost about \$65.

The Society received a check from IGS for sales of materials they have printed and sold on profit sharing. The 1860 census has been a big item. The IOOF Cemetery records are now on sale. Items published by IGS must be purchased from them. A listing and order blanks are available in the Society files. For anyone doing research, these items are a big help.

The Society asks members to make sure their Ancestor Charts are on file. If not, please send them to P.O.B. 84, Bloomfield, IA 52537 along with 1989 dues of \$5. The Society encourages members to attend the monthly meetings. They are preserving the past through personal histories. If anyone has diaries, journals, newspaper clippings, history books, thesis, etc., don't throw them away--donate them so others might learn of their heritage. 1/1/89

SHEET PROTECTORS - Poly vs. Vinyl: VINYL is made of plasticizers and is an acid-based material. Plasticizers cause VINYL to give off static electricity which can be a nuisance. The acid in VINYL can literally pull ink off printed pages and transfer it to the VINYL itself.

POLYPROPYLENE is acid-free and does not cause ink to migrate from the original documents. It contains no plasticizers, so it gives off less static electricity. VINYL protectors are usually available in a thicker material than POLYPROPYLENE but are not as strong. Both are clear. VINYL can turn yellow and crack with age; it will also tear---while the poly is said not to discolor or tear and is usually less expensive.--Key City (Dubuque).

NOTE: An ANCESTRY begins with a single individual and traces back in time to include the male and female lines of that person's ancestors. A full eight generations of one's ancestry would involve 511 persons.

A GENEALOGY, on the other hand, begins with a single ancestor and traces forward in time to include all descendants to the present.--Olmstead Co., MN.

DID YOU KNOW THAT--In genealogy, the term LINEAL means ascending or descending in a direct line; COLLATERAL means descended from the same ancestor but not in a direct line of descent; ALLIED FAMILIES are families related usually through marriage.

An old photograph with a funny looking little tax stamp (s) on the reverse side will enable you to put a date on it as tax stamps were only used on photos from September 1864 to August 1866.
