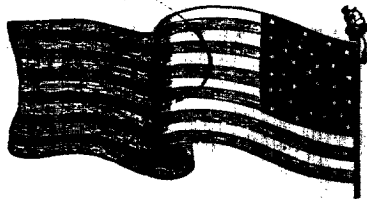

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled an "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. *6297* for *100* acres, in favor of *Chauncey Bond*, a corporal in Captain *Pittetons* Company of Connecticut Militia, War of 1812.

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon *the west half of the South west quarter and the South east quarter of the South west quarter of Section thirty four, in Township ninety one North, of Range twenty eight west, in the district of lands subject to sale at Fort Snodgrass, containing one hundred and twenty acres.*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the SURVEYOR GENERAL *the said warrant having been assigned by the said Chauncey Bond to Reuben Burtner, in whose favor said tracts have been located;*

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Reuben Burtner, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs.*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Reuben Burtner, as assignee as aforesaid and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, *Franklin Pierce* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
