## To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

**Whereas**, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 15,700 f issued in favor of Southrick Stebberd, Sengeautin Caplain Strykers Leonhany, New York Infanty, Man of 1862,
