WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 12102 for 160 acres, in favor of John

De Witt, Private, Captain Wilkinson's Company, New Jersey Militia, War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South East quarter of Section one, in Township Ninety two, North, of Range twenty seven West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa, containing one hundred and Sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by

the SURVEYOR GENERAL that said tract has been surveyed by

the said John De Witt, to Emerson C Wright, in whose farm said tract has been located,

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Emerson C Wright, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances

thereof, unto the said Emerson C Wright, as assignee as aforesaid and his

heirs and assigns forever.
