and to his heirs, the said tract above described: ~~to have and to hold~~ the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Casper Henry Bronkschinke,

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
