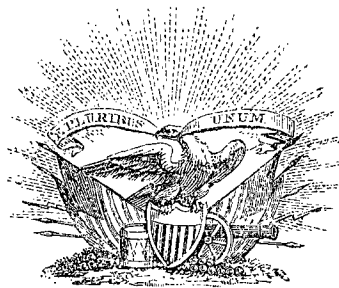


THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,



To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th,

1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 27,031 for 160 acres,

issued in favor of *Charles Bean, and Danville Bean, minor children of Jeremiah Bean, Deceased, Private in Captain Parlin's Company, Massachusetts Militia, War 1812;*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

South East quarter of Section four, in Township twentyone North, of Range thirtyone West, in the District of Iowa subject to sale at Fort Dodge, Iowa, containing One hundred and sixty Acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

the Tract of Land above described, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

John S. Abbott, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
