Elk Horn — Anna Margaret Andersen, daughter of Peter A. and Ella Nielsen Petersen was born Aug. 13, 1899 in Jackson twp., Shelby county. She was baptized and confirmed at the Immanuel Lutheran church in Kimballton, and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm in Shelby county.

On March 26, 1919, she married Peder C. Andersen at the Kimballton Immanuel Lutheran church. One son, Howard, was born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in the Shelby county area. In 1976, they moved to the Salem Retirement Home in Elk Horn. She then moved into the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn in June of 1980. She was a member of the Elk Horn Lutheran church, where she was also a member of the Ladie's Church Circle No. 4. She died at the Salem Lutheran Home on Saturday, Feb. 7, 1981, at age 81 years, 5 months and 24 days.
