

## Ingvard Andreasen

**HARLAN** — Ingvard (Ed) Andreasen, son of Hermand Christian and Ann Marie Larsen Andreasen was born June 8, 1896 in Rudkobing, Denmark. He died April 14, 1977 in Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, at age of 80 years, 10 months and six days. Ed was raised and educated in Denmark and in 1913, at the age of 17 he came to the U.S. and settled in Sexton. He later went to Salina, Colo., to work for the rail road for a year, before entering the U. S. Army in 1914, where he served for two years in the medical Corps. On Nov. 27, 1919 he married Ida Hinze in Ames, to this union four children were born. He attended Iowa State College in the dairy industry course and later went to Manly and started in the creamery business in 1921. In 1947 he purchased the Harlan Pasteurizing Co. and operated it for 12 years. Ed was a member of the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran church for 30 years and a 50 year member of the American Legion.

Mr Andreasen was preceded in death by his parents, his wife - Ida, one son - Howard, and one brother - Lawrence. Survivors include one son - Richard Andreasen of Milwaukie, Oreg., two daughters - Audrey (Mrs Paul R. Johnson) of Springfield, Mo., and Uarda (Mrs Edward Ford) of San Jose, Calif., one brother - Alfred Andreasen, two sisters -
