EARLING — Laurine Helen Block, daughter of Herman and Elizabeth Block, was born in Earling, on Dec. 17, 1914. She died at Myrtue hospital on Sept. 15, 1974, at age 59 years, 8 months, and 28 days. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Joseph's church in Earling and she graduated from St. Joseph's school there. In 1936 she moved to Omaha, Nebr., and this has been her home since that time. Since moving to Omaha, she has been a member of St. Wenceslaus church. She was employed for many years by the Continental Baking Co. of Omaha. She was a member of the Baker's Union Local No. 433 of Omaha.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by two sisters - Miss Mary Block and Mrs Louise Altman, and by six brothers - Henry, August, John, Leonard, Herman and Ernest Block. She is survived by four sisters - Augusta (Mrs Hugo Schmitz) of Earling, Josephine (Mrs William Schaben) of Defiance, Catherine (Mrs Clarence Schaben) of Defiance and Sister M. Brendon O.S.F. of Westphalia; by her nieces and nephews and other relatives.
