

Imre Boldizsar, 52

Imre Boldizsar, son of Louis and Caroline (Galos) Boldizsar, was born May 10, 1930 in Hungary. After attending school in Hungary, he was trained in the Army in two years. Then he worked as a miner for two years and then he did two more years of military service. After that, he worked in the mines until 1956, when he came to the U.S. to live with his uncle in Cleveland, Ohio. In 1957, he moved to Atlantic, where he was employed by Andrew's Roofing.

On Sept. 16, 1961, Imre married Alice Lorene Ordway at Atlantic. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Boldizsar made their home in Atlantic until 1963, when they moved to Harlan, where Imre worked at Western Iowa Pork and later, for Harlan Contracting. He then was self-employed for a short time repairing roofs before going to work at the Land O Lakes Beef Plant in Oakland, in 1979.

Mr Boldizsar was a member of the National Maritime Union of America, AFL-CIO. He died in Oakland on Dec. 1, 1982 at 52.

Imre was preceded in death by his father, Louis, and one daughter, Debra Luann in 1968. He is survived by his wife, Alice of Harlan; his son, Donald of Dallas, Texas; his daughter, Darla (Mrs Roger) Richardson of Avoca; his mother, Mrs Caroline Boldizsar of Hungary; two brothers, Louis and Imre's twin brother, Frank, both of Hungary; three sisters, Magdalena, Helen and Rosie, all of Hungary; nieces and

nephews; other relatives and a great many friends.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home on Dec. 4, 1982 with Jim Kelly of Christ's church in Harlan officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Lee Kenkel, Don Weddle, Gary Murray, Lowell Hupp, David Warner and Dennis Musich serving as casketbearers.
