

Rex Bradshaw, 74

Irwin — Rex Bradshaw was born near Norwood, Mo., on Feb. 4, 1904. At the age of 12, he moved to lowa and made his home with the Franklin Slates family in Kirkman. He attended the Kirkman high school and after graduating, farmed near Kirk-man. On March 3, 1927, he married Clara Kjer at the Baptist parsonage in Kirkman. One son

was born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Bradshaw farmed for many years in the Irwin and Kirkman vicinities. In 1954, they moved to Calif., where Rex worked as a cement finisher until retiring in 1969. In 1976, they moved to Ida Grove, to be near their son and family and this had been his home since that time. Mr Bradshaw died at the Horn Memorial hospital in Ida Grove on April 8, 1978 at age 74 years, two months 1978 at age 74 years, two months and four days.
