

# Edmund Campbell

**JACKSON** — Edmund Floyd Campbell, son of William and Marie Jensen Campbell, was born on a farm in Shelby county, on Febr. 9, 1907. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Dec. 24, 1976, at age 69 years, 10 months and 15 days. Edmund attended school and the Methodist church in Harlan and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. He married Myrtle Hansen on Jan. 16, 1937 at the Bethel Baptist Parsonage in Harlan. Two children were born to this union - Edna (Mrs Russell Greer) of Shelby, and Merle Campbell of Irwin. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Campbell made their home in Shelby, Pottawattamie and Harrison counties before moving to their present home in Jacksonville, in 1947. Ed retired as a driver for Petersen Brothers Trucking Co. in 1967 after 17 years of service.

He was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers - Harold, Owen and Ivan Campbell; and by one sister - Leta Morgan. In addition to his wife, Myrtle, daughter, Edna and son, Merle, he is survived by seven grandchildren; four sisters - Lucille Davis of Elk Horn, Imogene (Mrs Leland White) of Harlan; Arlene Montgomery of Harlan and Addy (Mrs Wendell Tague) of Sacramento, Calif.; two brothers - George of Harlan and Dwain of Portland, Oreg.; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Monday, Dec. 27, 1976 with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan and Rev. Howard Wolfgram, pastor of the Bethlehem Lutheran church of Jacksonville, officiating. Burial was in the Jacksonville cemetery, with Bob Paulsen, Arlo Petersen, Lynn Andersen, George Larsen, Ernest Petersen and Lester Petersen serving as casket-bearers.
