

Ray Seward Campbell, son of Hiram and Elizabeth Sweet Campbell, was born May 23, 1884 on a farm north of Walnut in Shelby County, Iowa. He died at Cass County Memorial hospital in Atlantic June 23, 1972, just one month after his 88th birthday. He was married to Mary Margaret Cissna March 23, 1910 in Council Bluffs. To this union two children were born. They are: Janice (Mrs Ray Errett) of Papillion, Neb., and Floyd of Walnut. The Campbells farmed northeast of Harlan for one year, and in the Walnut vicinity for twelve years. In 1924 they moved to a farm north of Harlan, where they lived until 1946. They then moved into their home in Kirkman. After the death of Mrs Campbell, in April of 1959, Mr Campbell made his home with his son, Floyd, and wife, Thelma, for eight years. For the last four years he has been a resident of the peace Haven Home in Walnut. Mr Campbell was a member of the United Methodist church of Kirkman and he was a member of Morro Lodge No. 559, A.F. & A.M. of Walnut.

Other than his wife, he was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers - Mott, Ed, and Hiram H. Campbell; and three sisters; Mrs Nan Mickel, Mrs Jennie Murphy and Mrs Lucy Riley.

Mr Campbell is survived by his two children; his twin brother, Roy, of Hancock, Iowa; six grandchildren; fifteen great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, June 27, 1972 at Pauley Home for Funerals in Harlan with Pastor John A. Wallace officiating.

Burial was at Harlan cemetery in Harlan, Iowa with Jack Coe, John Mayne, Dennis Errett, Richard Adams, Larry Campbell and Richard Campbell serving as casket bearers. Masonic services were conducted at the graveside by Morro Lodge No. 559, A.F. & A.M. of Walnut, Iowa.
