DONALD CARL, 80

Donald Carl, son of W.H. and Amy Bergstresser Carl, was born Oct. 21, 1893 in Harlan. He died at Veterans Administration hospital in Omaha, Nebr. on July 15, 1974 at age 80 years, 8 months, 24 days. On May 13, 1918 he became a member of the U.S. Army and he served his Country overseas in France during WWI. After his discharge on Aug. 18, 1919, he returned to Harlan. He married Edna D. Richards in Clarion, on Nov. 17, 1919. Three sons were born to this union: Victor of Harlan, Jack of Beaverton, Oreg., and Richard of Harlan. They have made their home in Harlan all their married life.

Mr Carl was preceded in death by his parents, his sister, Florence Carl and his brother, Burton Carl. In addition to his wife, Edna, and his three sons, Mr Carl is survived by three grandsons and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Pauley Home for Funerals in Harlan on Wednesday, July 17, 1974 with Rev S.L. Schuler, pastor of Irwin Church of Christ, officiating. Military rites were conducted by members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 941 of Harlan. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Roy Wittrup, Milford Rold, C.W. Nelson, Larry Richards, Don E. Blakely and Clifford Hanson serving as pallbearers.
