

Henry R. Chamberlain, 62

Henry Rufus Chamberlain, son of Frederick and Clara Mae Ziebold Chamberlain, was born Feb. 28, 1919 on his parents' farm in Mondamin. He grew to adulthood in the Mondamin and Logan areas.

On May 20, 1946, he married Marcella Hughes at Hiawatha, Kans. Two daughters were born to this union. After their marriage, they lived in the Modale area while he worked for various farmers including Joe Baker and Leal Oliver. In 1966, they moved to Harlan, where he was employed as a renderer for Land O'Lakes in Oakland, until retiring on July 10, 1981.

He died at Jennie Edmondson Memorial hospital in Co. Bluffs on Monday, Oct. 12, 1981, at the age of 62 years.
