## Hunter B. Dahlof, 18

Hunter Brent Dahlof, the son of Howard and Barbara Dahlof, was born April 26, 1966 in Harlan. He was baptized at the Red Line Church of Christ in Red Line. Hunter attended school in Harlan and graduated from H.C.H.S. with the Class of 1984.

While growing up he was involved with many activities which included his church, school and community, was active in church bible school, Sunday school, youth activities and was a song leader.

During his school years he was active with the Harlan stage band in both Harlan junior high school and Harlan Community high school for six years, was in Marching Band, Concert Band, in which he played first chair trombone and participated in Pep Band. He was active in chorus and assisted with the sound system and recording the school's concerts and programs.

For one year he was vice president of the Future Farmers of America, and in his senior year was awarded the Iowa Farmers Degree by the Iowa Chapter of Future Farmers of America at a banquet in Des Moines. He had recently attended freshman orientation at Northwest Missouri St. University at Maryville, Mo.

He was also active in 4-H and was president of the Boots and Saddle 4-H club. In June he assisted with the Fiscus centennial parade in Fiscus. He died at work accidentally in Harlan on Monday, July 2, 1984 at the age of 18 years, 2 months and 5 days.

He is preceded in death by his maternal grandfather and his paternal grandparents. He is survived by his parents Howard and Barbara Dahlof of Walnut; two sisters Ila Jean Lytle of Colorado Springs, Colo. and Rosalie (Mrs James) Carlson of Kirkman; his maternal grandmother Matilda Hart of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held on Thursday, July 5, 1984 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Tom Gaer officiating and Gary Jorgensen and Scott Lambert assisting.

Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Tim Hart, Paul Plumb, Bill Thygesen, Scott Lambert, Glenn Wingert, Kelly Robinson, Todd A. Dahlof and Philip Daringer Jr., all serving as casketbearers.
