

## Lucille P. Davis, 78

Harlan — Lucille Pearl Davis, daughter of William M. and Mamie Elliott Campbell, was born on a farm in Monroe twp., Shelby county, on Dec. 20, 1900. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. She was a member of the Harlan Methodist church.

She married A.M. Davis and they made their home in various places including Yellowstone National Park, where Mr Davis worked for the United States Park Service. Due to ill health, Mrs Davis became a resident of the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn in 1966 and this has been her home since that time. It was here that she died on Saturday, Sept. 15, 1979, at age 78 years, 8 months and 25 days. Lucille had been a member of the Baptist church after her marriage.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; two brothers - Harold and Owen; a sister, Leta Morgan; and two half-brothers, Ivan and Edmund. Her survivors include a brother, George Campbell of Harlan; three half-sisters, Arlene (Mrs Robert Montgomery) and Imogene (Mrs Leland White), both of Harlan and Addy (Mrs Wendell Tague) of Sacramento, Calif.; a half-brother, Dwain Campbell of Portland, Oregon; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Monday, Sept. 17, 1979, with Pastor J. Harry Thomsen, Chaplain of the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Howard Hansen, Keith Campbell, Quentin Rickers, Russell Campbell, David A. Christensen and Arnold R. Christensen serving as casket-bearers.
