Panama — Aloysius Joseph Feldman, son of Henry Joseph and Adeline Graeve Feldman was born Dec. 12, 1909 on a farm near Earling and was baptized at St. Joseph's Catholic church in Earling.

As a young boy, he moved with his family to a farm near Portsmouth. On June 2, 1942 he was inducted into the U.S. Army to serve his country as a Staff Sergeant during World War II until he received an honorable discharge on Nov. 12, 1945, he then returned to Panama to farm with his father.

On Nov. 26, 1946, he married Isabel Blum at St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama. Seven children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home on a farm northwest of Panama. This has been their home since that time.

He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama as well as a member of the Panama American Legion Post No. 601 and the Panama Community Club.

He died at St. Joseph's hospital, Omaha on Wednesday, July 15, 1981, at the age of 71 years.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one sister, Helen Henner.
