The Life Story of —  
CLAY E. FISCUS, 85

Clay Everett Fiscus, the son of Elisha and Nora Fiscus, was born May 18, 1887 on a farm in Polk Township, near Fiscus in Shelby County, Iowa. He attended school and grew to adulthood there.

He then moved to Omaha, Nebraska and has spent the rest of his life in the Omaha and Council Bluffs vicinity, where he was a proprietor of a garage. He later was employed by Yellow Cab Company in Omaha and he worked there until his retirement.

He died after a lingering illness, at St. Joseph's hospital in Omaha, Nebraska June 10, 1972, just 23 days after his 85th birthday.

Mr Fiscus was preceded in death by his son, Sherman, in the early 1950's.

Survivors include three daughters and their husbands - Eva and LeRoy McKeown of Council Bluffs, Iowa; Vonña and John Schubert of Council Bluffs, Iowa; and Connie and James Little of Buffalo, Minnesota; by nine grandchildren; twelve great grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Home for Funerals in Harlan, Iowa, June 14, 1972, with Pastor Peter M. Kemper of the First Baptist Church, officiating.

Burial was at Harlan cemetery, with LeRoy McKeown, Dick Schubert, Donald Schubert, James A. Little, Jeffrey J. Little and Kenneth L. Fiscus serving as casket bearers.
