Harlan — Edith Mae Green, daughter of William and Eva Belle McDonald Chipman, was born on a farm in Lincoln Twp., Shelby county on June 9, 1907. She was baptized at the Shelby Methodist church. She attended a country school and grew to adulthood on her parents' farm in Lincoln Twp.

On Dec. 24, 1925, she married Grant E. Green in the Harlan Methodist parsonage. Two daughters were born to this union. They spent many of their married years farming in Shelby county. After Mr Green's retirement in 1956, they moved to Harlan. Mrs Green worked in the bakery at Harlan high school for several years, and then for many years worked in the cafeteria.

Following her daughter, Doris' death in 1960, her husband's death in 1962, and her own retirement in 1972, Mrs Green continued to make her home in Harlan. Mrs Green was a member of the First United Methodist church, Harlan where she was a member of the Wesleyan Circle and Builders class. She was also a member of the Zenobia Rebecca Lodge No. 286. Mrs Green died at St. Joseph's hospital in Omaha, Neb., on Monday, June 23, 1980, at age of 73 years and 14 days.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by one daughter, Doris Mae, and one brother, Wayne.
