LARRY N. GREINER, 65

Lawrence Nicholas Greiner, know to everyone as Larry, son of John and Mar Steyver Greiner, was born Dec. 23, 1909, in Panama. He died at Bishop Clarkson Memorial hospital in Omaha, Nebr., on Mar. 6, 1975, at age 65 years, 2 months and 13 days. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic church in Panama. He graduated from St. Mary's high school in Panama and attended St. Benedict's College in Atchison, Kans., for three years. After his schooling he worked in Kansas City and Oklahoma City for several years. In 1940 he moved to Harlan, where for 27 years he and his wife operated Greiner's Cafe. In 1967 he entered into the bee keeping business and also was employed by the State of Iowa as a Bee Inspector. In 1945 he married Mildred Brue in Ashland, Nebr.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one sister, Margaret, and one brother, Donald. In addition to his wife, Mildred, he is survived by one daughter - Katherine Culp, of Bellflower, Calif., and one son, Bruce of Brookfield Center, Conn. and two grandchildren; by three brothers - Leonard Greiner and Jerry Greiner, both of Harlan, and Bob Greiner of Creston, nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held on Monday, Mar. 10, 1975 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, with Rev. Anthony J. Palmer, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Bob Ross, Lee White, Glen Stanley, Elmer Schwery, Floyd Atkinson and Darold Wittrup serving as pallbearers.
