

Grace L. Hall, 70

Harlan — Grace Louise Hall was born in Harlan on Feb. 12, 1910, daughter of Chris and Louise Rasmussen Bartelson. At age six, Grace moved with her family to Phoenix, Ariz., where she attended school and grew to adulthood. After completing high school, she moved back to Harlan, where she was baptized at the Church of Christ in Redline in 1931, and was a long time member.

On March 23, 1930, Grace married Merle Hall at the Bartelson home in Harlan. They farmed north and east of Harlan for many years. After his death on April 20, 1961, she moved to Washington D.C., where she made her home with her sister, Ann Ashcraft, and was a member of the Church of Christ in Washington. She was employed there as a secretary for the U.S. Senate, and was a member of the Senate Staff club, until she retired in 1974.

Mrs Hall continued to live in Washington until her death on Wednesday, Sept. 3, 1980, at George Washington University hospital in Washington D.C., at age 70 years, 6 months and 21 days.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by five brothers, Henry, Peter, William, John and

Leotis. Survivors include her foster son, Clayton Sanders of Harlan, and her sister, Ann Ashcraft, of Washington D.C. and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Saturday, Sept. 6, 1980 with Tom Gaer, officiating.

Burial was in Red Line cemetery, Shelby county, with Victor Julius, Calvin Bartelson, Ronald Bartelson, Allyn Bartelson, and Dale Lambertson serving as casketbearers.
