Glen L. Hansen, 59

Harlan - Glen Leo Hansen, son of Carl P. and Anna Gronlund Hansen, was born in Randolph, Nebr., on Aug. 25, 1921. He was a baptized and confirmed member of the Immanuel Lutheran church of Coolridge, Nebr. Glen attended school at Coolridge until going to an aircraft mechanic school in Lincoln, Nebr. He served his country in WWII as a tail gunner in England and returned successfully from all of his missions. After receiving his honorable discharge in 1945, he came to Harlan and taught flight school and barbered for many years. He also raised Palomino Quarter horses as a hobby and was a member of the V.F.W. Post No. 941 in Harlan, Iowa.

On June 17, 1966, he married Ileine Ulfers at the First United Methodist church in Harlan. He also owned and operated the Harmony Inn in Harlan for many years, until he retired last March because of his health. He died at Montclair Nursing Home in Omaha on Friday, Sept. 12, 1980, 28 days after his 59th birthday.

Survivors include his wife, Ileine of Harlan; four sons - Edward of Ft. Collins, Colo., Larry of Poway, Calif., Michael of Harlan and Dwain of Omaha, Nebr.; 12 grandchildren; two brothers, Charles Hansen and Robert Hansen, both of Coolridge, Nebr., and one sister, Helen (Mrs. Al) Krei of Coolridge, Nebr.; and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home, on Tuesday, Sept. 16, 1980 with Pastor Emil C. Martinson of St. Paul's Lutheran church in Irwin, Officiating. Burial
