Harlan — Glenn Marion Hansen, son of Hans and Anna Brodersen Hansen, was born on a farm in Jackson twp, Shelby county on June 23, 1911. He attended school at Jacksonville and grew to adulthood on his parents' farm. On Dec. 29, 1937, he married Irene Pauley in Shenandoah. One son was born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in Center twp. and later in Douglas twp. They retired in 1969 and moved into Harlan and this has been their home since that time. They were privileged to celebrate their 41st wedding anniversary this past Dec.

Glenn helped organize the Kirkman Volunteer Fire Department and enjoyed a special hobby of flying as a private pilot. He died at St. Joseph's hospital in Omaha, Neb., on Saturday, May 19, 1979, at 67 years, 10 months and 26 days. He had been a long time member of the First United

Methodist church in Harlan. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, Mike. He is survived by his wife, Irene, of Harlan; his son, Marion of Schenectady, N.Y., a brother, Herbert of Storm Lake; a sister, Gladys (Mrs Everette Johnson) of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Tuesday, May 22, 1979, with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Virgil Wilcox, Gregory McCabe, Jack R. Knudsen, Fred Louis, Jr., Norman Sondergard and Orlin (Buck) Pauley serving as casketbearers.
