Elmer Marion Havick, 67

Elmer M. Havick, son of Frank and Essie Bryant Havick was born July 1, 1915 on a farm in Lincoln twp., Shelby co. He attended school in Tennant and grew to adulthood helping on the family farm.

Elmer married Wilma Andersen on March 15, 1939 at the Little Brown church at Nashua. Three sons were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed for a short time near Kirkman before purchasing a farm near Avoca. While living near Avoca, Elmer and Wilma became members of the Presbyterian church there.

Elmer was a 4-H and Boy's Scout leader for many years, helping his three sons and many other boys attain the rank of Eagle Scout.

In 1960, Elmer became associated with the Federal Crop Ins. program, first as a sales representative and later as a supervisor. He held this position until his retirement earlier this year.

Mr and Mrs Havick retired from the farm in 1977 and moved to Harlan. At this time they changed their church affiliation and became members of the First United Methodist church, Harlan. Elmer died at Jennie Edmundson hospital in Co. Bluffs on Feb. 18, 1983 having attained the age of 67 years, 7 months and 17 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two sisters, Esther and Mabel Davis; and two brothers, Glen and Everett Havick. He was also preceded in death by a granddaughter Jody Lynn Havick.

He is survived by his wife Wilma of Harlan; three sons, Bruce Havick of Harlan, Jim Havick of Belleville, Kans., and Steven Havick of Coon Rapids; two sisters, Gladys Klitgaard and Helen (Mrs Arnold) Christensen, both of Harlan and three brothers Claude Havick of Mapleton, Harold Havick of Harlan and Franklin Havick of Oakland. He is also survived by eight grandchildren, nieces and nephews, other relatives and many friends.

Funeral services were held at First United Methodist church in Harlan on Monday, Feb. 21, 1983 with Dr. Larry LaVelle, officiating.
