VIOLET HECK, 90

IRWIN — Violet Edna Belle Heck, daughter of George E. and Mary Richards Heck, was born Febr. 22, 1884 on a farm northeast of Irwin, where she grew to womanhood. Following her graduation from the local schools, she taught in the rural schools. In later years, the family moved to Irwin, where she has made her home until Sept. of 1971. At that time she became ill and moved to the Otto Kloewer home in Harlan, where she was cared for by Mrs Kloewer. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on July 12, 1974, at age 90 years, 4 months, 20 days.

She was preceded in death by her parents, three brothers - William A., John E., and Albert J.; and one sister - Rosa Alice Heck Fogarty.

Miss Heck has been a faithful member of the Irwin Church of Christ since she was a young girl. Survivors include two nephews - George W. Fogarty of Valley City, N. Dak., and James O. Fogarty of Murfreesboro, Ark., and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, July 16, 1974, at the Irwin Church of Christ with Pastor Sidney L. Schuler, officiating and the Pauley Home for Funerals in charge. Burial was in Oak Hill cemetery, Irwin, with Frank Birks, James Wickersham, Normal Richards, Melvin Carter, John H. Steenhusen and Peter Steenhusen Sr. serving as pallbearers.
