



THE LIFE STORY OF —  
**Thelma  
Jamison,**

Thelma Marie Jamison, daughter of Charles and Alida M. (Hollock) Wolke, was born in Springview, Nebr., on Dec. 15, 1903. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Nov. 5, 1976, at age 72 years, 10 months and 20 days. She was baptized in the Methodist church in Springview where she attended grade school. She then moved with her parents to Omaha, Nebr. She graduated from Central high school in Omaha and attended Nebraska Wesleyan College in Lincoln, Nebr. On Dec. 14, 1936, she married Willard Shaw in Omaha, Nebr. After their marriage, they made their home in Omaha for two years before moving to Malvern, where they operated the Red & White Grocery for over 20 years. In 1959 Thelma moved to Kansas City and then in 1961 moved to Omaha, Nebr., where she was employed by Younkers. On May 19, 1968, she married Lynn S. Jamison at Omaha. After their marriage, they made their home in Harlan. She was a member of the First United Methodist church of Harlan and had retained her membership in the Silver Urn Chapter No. 168, Order of Eastern Star of Malvern.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her sister, Marian Jamison in 1966. She is survived by her husband, Lynn A. Jamison, of Harlan; her son, Steven Shaw, of Urbandale and by two grandchildren; by two brothers - Gerald Wolfe of Omaha and Dale Wolfe of Ft. Collins, Colo., one sister, Mildred (Mrs Paul Newman) of Casper, Wyo., and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Monday, Nov. 8, 1976, with Rev. D. Ward Young officiating. Eastern Star services were conducted by the Silver Urn Chapter No. 168, O.E.S. of Malvern. Burial was in Hillcrest Memorial Park cemetery in Omaha, Nebr., with Art Jensen, Donald Briley, Roger Thomsen, Keith Crawford, Frank Andersen and Elmer (Sparky) Larsen serving as casketbearers.
