

Mrs Inger Jensen, 89

Harlan — Inger Margaret Jensen, daughter of Englebrecht and Anna Smidt Petersen, was born in Ribe, Denmark, on Oct. 8, 1889. She was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran church. She attended school and grew to adulthood in Denmark. After coming to the U.S., Inger made her home in Shelby county.

On April 10, 1912, she married Martin J. Jensen at his family home in Jackson twp. After their marriage, they made their home on a farm near Jacksonville until 1945 when they moved to Harlan. After Martin's death in Aug. of 1962, Inger continued to make her home in Harlan. She became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in the fall of 1973 and this has been her home since that time. It was here that she died on Sunday, April 29, 1979 at age 89 years, 6 months and 21 days. Mrs Jensen had been a member of Immanuel Lutheran church and ILCW in Harlan.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Peter and Hans Petersen; and by a sister, Elise Kargaard. She is survived by nieces and nephews and other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Thursday, May 3, 1979, with Pastor Clifford H. Nelson of the Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Harry Krohn, Andrew L. Pokorny, Roy L. Christensen, Vernon G. Petersen, R. Glenn Rasmussen, and Arnold R. Christensen serving as casketbearers.
