# Anna C. Jorgensen, 80

**Kimballton** — Anna Christina Jorgensen was born Aug. 31, 1900 in Audubon county, daughter of Chris T. and Jensine Caspersen Clausen. She was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. She was currently a member of the World Wide Church of God. She attended country school.

On April 16, 1925 she married Albert Christian Jorgensen. They farmed in Audubon county all their married life. Her husband, Chris died Dec. 23, 1969. She continued to live on the farm north and east of Kimballton with her two sons until Feb. of this year when she became ill and entered the hospital. She moved to the Salem Nursing Home in Elk Horn where she died Tuesday, Sept. 9, 1980, at age 80 years.

She was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, one brother, Casper Clausen; and three sisters, Solvig Clausen, Valborg (Mrs Harry Sorensen) and Christine (Mrs Fred Sorensen). Survivors include her two sons, Emmert and Raymond, both of Kimballton; three brothers, Niels Clausen of Anita, Mads Clausen of the Salem Home in Elk Horn, Christian Clausen of Kimballton; and three sisters, Amalie (Mrs Martin) Mikkelsen and Martine (Mrs Viggo) Hansen both of Los Angeles, Calif., and Thomine (Mrs Sigurd) Christensen of Harlan.

Graveside services were held at the Bethany Lutheran cemetery in Kimballton on Friday, Sept. 12, 1980 with Mr Arthur Docken of Blair, Neb., officiating.
