## Judith Kaufman

Judith Ann Kaufman, daughter of John D. and Lola (Rock) Carroll, was born on a farm in Fairview twp. in Shelby county, on July 14, 1943. She died at her home west of Harlan, on Dec. 27, 1976 at age of 33 years, 5 months and 13 days. She grew up on her parent's farm. She attended country school and high school in Avoca, graduating in 1961. She then attended Barnes Beauty School in Co. Bluffs. After graduating, she worked in beauty shops in Harlan for several years before opening her own shop, Judy's Fashion Curl, which she operated for 8 years. On June 29, 1963, she married Mike Kaufman at St. Mary's church in Avoca. Two sons were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Kaufman made their home in Harlan until June of 1976 when they moved to a farm west of Harlan. This has been her home since that time. Judy was a member of St. Michael's church in Harlan.

She was preceded in death by her parents and by a brother, J. Kenneth Carroll. Her survivors include her husband, Mike, of rural Harlan; two sons - Jerry and Bruce, both at home; two brothers - Wilbur Carroll of Harlan and Everette Carroll of Avoca; six sisters - Mrs Lorene Nelsen, Mildred (Mrs Kenneth Petersen), Betty (Mrs Don Langer) and Dorothy (Mrs Marland Mattox) all of Avoca, Bertha (Mrs Robert Kixmiller) of Walnut and Wilma Jean (Mrs David Klindt) of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Michael's church in Harlan, on Wednesday, Dec. 29, 1976, with Rev. Richard Wagner as celebrant. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Keith Weller, David Kaufman, Duane Carroll, Randy Schwarte, Lester Petersen and Robert A. Kixmiller serving as pallbearers.
