

Thomas Kolb, 70

Harlan — Thomas Gordon Kolb, son of William and Addie May Clark Kolb, was born on a farm in Clay twp., Shelby county, on Nov. 6, 1909. He attended the Clay twp. No. 3 country school and grew to adulthood on the family farm.

Gordon, along with his brothers, farmed the Kolb family farm until retiring in 1969 and moving to Harlan. He continued to live in Harlan until becoming a resident of the Salem Lutheran Home, Elk Horn in 1978 and this has been his home since that time. Mr Kolb died at Bishop Clarkson Memorial hospital in Omaha, Nebr., on Monday, April 7, 1980, at age 70 years, five months and one day.

He was preceded in death by his parents. Survivors include two brothers - Lewis Kolb of Harlan and Charles Kolb of Elk Horn; a sister, Eunice Kolb of Los Angeles, Calif.; nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Thursday, April 10, 1980, with Dr. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the Harlan-Monroe Chapel United Methodist Churches, officiating. Burial was in the Monroe twp. cemetery, Shelby county, with Larry Kolb, Warren Kolb, Jerry Hansen, Melvin Fiscus, Gaylord Doonan and Robert Roenfeld serving as casketbearers.
