



THE LIFE STORY OF —

Clara C. Langenfeld, 84

Westphalia — Clara Catherine Langenfeld, daughter of Jacob and Catherine Leffleman Langenfeld, was born on a farm in Shelby county near Westphalia, on Aug. 3, 1895. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Boniface church in Westphalia. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. Clara attended college in Carroll, where she studied to be a seamstress. After completing her schooling, she returned to her parent's farm where she worked as a seamstress. When her parents retired from farming, she moved with them into Westphalia and cared for them. This was her home until becoming a resident of Little Flower Haven in Earling in May of 1977.

Clara died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, Tuesday, Oct. 9, 1979, at age 84 years, two months and six days. She had been a life time member of St. Boniface church in Westphalia and was a member of the Alter Society. She had also been a member of the Third Order of St. Francis.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by two brothers - John and George Langenfeld; and three sisters - Rosie Hoffman, Anna Grady and Dora Rueschenberg. She is survived by a number of nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Boniface in Westphalia, on Thursday, Oct. 11, 1979, with Rev. Michael Sims as celebrant. Burial was in St. Boniface cemetery, Westphalia, with John Langenfeld, Ed Rueschenberg, Mike Rueschenberg, Richard Langenfeld, Delbert Rueschenberg and Quentin Rueschenberg serving as pallbearers. 1979
