Elvina R. Malick was born on a farm near Defiance, March 4, 1917, the daughter of Andrew and Matilda Johnson Rasmussen. She was baptized at an early age at a rural Lutheran church in Shelby co. She was raised on the farm and received her education through the 8th grade at the local country school near her home. Then she moved to Harlan where she was employed doing domestic work. She later moved to her sister's home in Co. Bluffs and worked at Swansons in Omaha.

Feb. 3, 1946 she married Gerald Malick at Topeka, Kans. They made their home in Co. Bluffs for six years before moving to Denison in 1952. For many years she was employed as the head of the laundry department at the Eventide Lutheran Home in Denison, retiring in 1978. She spent her retirement years at their home in Denison.

Elvina entered the Crawford county Memorial hospital in Denison Sept. 29 and it was there she died Oct. 17. She was 65 years old.

She was a member of the Rebekahs in Harlan.

She was preceded in death by her parents, one brother, Elmer Rasmussen and six brothers and sisters who died in infancy.
