

John C. Mayne, 68

Harlan — John Charles Mayne, son of William Henry and Elizabeth Gibbs Mayne was born April 11, 1912, on a farm in Center Twp., Shelby county. He grew to adulthood on his parent's farm and attended school in Harlan, graduating from high school there in 1931. He served his country in WW II as a Pvt. in the Enlisted Reserve Corps, Army of the U. S. After receiving an honorable discharge, he returned to Shelby county to care for his parents and help on the farm. After their deaths, he moved into Harlan. For several years he was the clerk of the Harlan House Hotel.

He died at Creighton Memorial-St. Joseph's hospital in Omaha, Neb., on Sunday, Nov. 16, 1980, at age 68 years, 7 months and 5 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one sister, Alice. He is survived by many cousins.

Funeral services were held at St. Paul's Episcopal church in Harlan on Thursday, Nov. 20, 1980, with Fr. Glenn Rankin, officiating. Burial was in Harlan cemetery with Daryl Jensen, Kevin Meaney, Levi Andersen, Lee Sunderland, Sheldon Nelson and Arthur Andersen serving as casketbearers. Military rites were conducted at the cemetery by American Legion, Helmer Reyelt Post No. 150 of Harlan.
