

The Lite Story of -- 1975
AGNES MILLER, 83

EARLING — Mary Agnes Miller, known to all as Agnes, daughter of Charles and Julia Sullivan Tofflemeiere was born in St. Joseph, Mo., on Jan. 16, 1892. She died at Crawford County Memorial hospital in Denison, on Mar. 16, 1975 just two months after her 83rd birthday. As a young girl she moved with her parents to Orient, where she attended school and grew to adulthood. In 1912 she moved to Earling, where she was employed as a Milliner. On Jan. 27, 1913, she married Nick A. Miller in the Catholic church at Orient. Five children were born to this union. After their marriage they made their home in Earling, where Mr Miller operated the Miller Grain Elevator. For most of her adult life, she has been a member of St. Joseph's Catholic church in Earling. She also was a charter member of St. Katherine's Court No. 266 Catholic Daughters of America, and belonged to St. Joseph's Altar Society.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Nick, on Jan. 17, 1952, and her two brothers - Dr. Charles Tofflemeire and Francis Tofflemeire. She is survived by three daughters - Eileen, (Mrs Bill Jacoby) of Menlo, Mary, (Mrs Chester Wellington) of Denver, Colo., and Pat, (Mrs Junior Carstens) of Manilla, and two sons - Leo F. Miller, D.D.S. of Stuart and Leonard Miller of Earling, 11 grandchildren; 11 great grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Mar. 20, 1975, at St. Joseph's Catholic church in Earling with Rev Msgr. Michael Schwarte as celebrant. Burial was in St. Joseph's cemetery in Earling, with Bill Jacoby, Jr., Richard Miller, Dick VanAernam, Bill Beaman, Mike Smith, Tony Miller serving as pallbearers.
