



Mrs Clarence Patterson, 80

Belle Plaine, Ia. — Lucille Beryl Patterson, daughter of Ole B. and Bertha Olina Erickson Olson, was born on a farm in Douglas twp, Shelby county, on Nov. 21, 1898. She attended Kirkman school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. After graduating from the Kirkman high school, she taught for a couple of years in rural schools in the area.

On June 4, 1923, she married George Errett in Mo. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home on a farm in Center twp for 27 years. Lucille returned to school at U.N.I. in Cedar Falls and Drake University in Des Moines to take extra college courses. She taught for 20 years in the Kirkman, Irwin and Harlan school systems.

On June 29, 1963, she married Clarence Patterson at the First United Methodist church in Harlan and they made their home in Harlan. After Clarence's death in Jan., of 1975, Lucille became a resident of the Beverly Manor Nursing Home in Belle Plaine, and this has been her home since that time. It was here that she died on Wednesday, June 27, 1979, at age of 80 years, 7 months and 6 days. She was a long time member of the Kirkman Methodist church and later the First United Methodist church in Harlan. She was also a member of the Lebanon Chapter No. 8, O.E.S., Zenobia Rebekah Lodge No. 286, and the Federated Friday club until poor health forced her to retire.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by a daughter, Shirley; four brothers - Frank, Henry, Ernest and Ben Olson; and by a sister, Josephine Plattenberg. Survivors include a son, Harold Errett of Valinda, Calif.; a daughter, Maxine (Mrs John Lawlor) of Belle Plaine; a step-son, Gerald Patterson of Des Moines; four grandchildren; a brother, Fred Olson of Denver, Colo.; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Saturday, June 30, 1979, with Rev. Leon V. Wallace, pastor of the Kirkman United Methodist church, officiating. Burial was in the Rose Hill cemetery in Kirkman with Don Blakely, L.S. Morgan, Almer Hansen, Lloyd Obrecht, Gaillard Heflin and Dr. Gary Jorgensen serving as casketbearers.
