

Catherine Peschel Buried January 19

Catherine M. Book, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Book, was born in Harlan, Ia., on May 6, 1879. The family moved to Norfolk, Neb., where Catherine attended grade school.

On February 26, 1906, she was married to Frank J. Peschel in Osmond. To this union were born Harold of Norfolk; Mrs. Peter [Catherine] Borgmann, Creighton, Mrs. Gerald [Dorothy] Coenen, Plainview, and Frank of Osmond.

The greatest portion of Mrs. Peschel's life was spent on a farm in the Osmond vicinity. Exceptions were eight years in Sioux City, at which time her husband was employed as a streetcar conductor, and short periods in Randolph, Plainview and South Dakota.

Mrs. Peschel was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church, the Christian Mothers and St. Mary's Guild.

She passed away on January 16, 1966, at the age of 86 years, 8 months and 10 days, at St. Joseph Community Hospital at Osmond. She had been hospitalized about six weeks and her death was attributed to a heart attack. Her husband, parents, three sisters, one brother and one grandson preceeded her in death.

In addition to many friends and relatives, she is mourned by her four children, one brother Andrew Book of Norfolk, 19 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held on January 19, 1966, at St. Mary's Catholic Church here with Mrs. Peschel's grandson, Rev. Ronald Peschel, officiating. Mass servers were James Peschel and Robert Wingert; candle bearers Phillip Luebbers and Danle Morfeld, and cross bearer was Donald Coenen. Music was furnished by St. Mary's Choir under the direction of Sister Agatha Marie.

Mrs. Peschel Dies At Local Hospital

Mrs. Frank Peschel, mother of Frank Peschel of this community, a son in Norfolk and daughters in Plainview and Creighton, died unexpectedly of a heart attack at St. Joseph Community Hospital here about noon Sunday, January 16.

Mrs. Peschel had re-entered the hospital early this year after receiving treatment there during late November and most of December. She lived alone and in good health until recently in her home directly south of St. Mary's School. The Peschels retired from active farm life to Osmond in 1945. Mr. Peschel died in 1959.

The Requiem funeral High Mass was read by her grandson, Father Roland Peschel, assistant pastor of St. Mary's parish, Omaha, this [Wednesday] morning at 10:30 a.m. at St. Mary's Church here followed by interment in the church cemetery.
