

Judson E. Randerson, 90

ELK HORN — Judson Edward Randerson, son of Joseph and Donna (Sharp) Randerson, was born on a farm near Rockton, Ill., on Jan. 10, 1887. As a young boy he moved with his parents to Rockford, Ill., where he attended school and grew to adulthood. On Dec. 26, 1911, he married Galeta Gates in Sioux City. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Randerson made their home in Logan, where he was employed by the Hetrick Clothing Co. in 1917 they moved to Malvern, where he operated his own clothing store for over 50 years. After retiring in 1968, Mr and Mrs Randerson continued to live in Malvern. After his wife's death on May 12, 1976, Judson became a resident of the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn. In Dec. of 1976 he became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan. It was here that he died on Dec. 22, 1977, at age 90 years, 11 months and 12 days. Mr Randerson was a member of the Presbyterian church.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Banner and Harley. He is survived by his daughter, Barbara Ouren of Harlan; three grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Mansfield-Hertz Funeral Home in Malvern, on Dec. 24, 1977, with Rev. Charles E. Cowell, Jr., officiating. Burial was in the Malvern cemetery with Greg Pierce, Earl G. Bass, Russell McKee, Dale Stephens, William D. Baer, and Charles Costello serving as casketbearers.
