

Victor C. Robertson, 65

California — Victor Clair Robertson, son of Frank Louis (Jimmy) and Hazel Johnson Robertson was born Oct. 11, 1915, in Shelby. He grew up in Shelby and at age 17, moved to Green River, Wyo. There he became employed at the Union Pacific Railroad where he worked as a breakman and conductor for many years.

He served his country in WW II in the Army from April 1941-Dec. of 1945. After receiving an honorable discharge, he returned to Green River and continued to work for the railroad until 1975, when he retired. In 1976, Mr Robertson moved to San Diego, Calif., where he has resided even since. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Rawlins, Wyo. He died at Mission Bay hospital, San Diego, Calif., on Tuesday, Nov. 10, 1980, at age of 65 years, one month and 7 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents. Survivors include two brothers, Vance of Co. Bluffs, Iowa and Gary of Elk Horn and three sisters, Betty Doyl of Lincoln, Neb.; Shirley (Mrs Art) Cox and Joann (Mrs Don) Sahl, both of Omaha, Neb.; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home, Saturday, Nov. 22, 1980, with Rev. Chuck Smith, Pastor of Marne and Buck Creek United Methodist churches, officiating. Burial was in Shelby cemetery, with Don Sahl, Kevin Sahl, Arthur Cox, Stacy Robertson, Tracy Robertson and Terry Robertson serving as casketbearers. Military rites were conducted at the cemetery by the American Legion Post No. 240 of Shelby.
