

## Boyd Dale Sandage, 58

Irwin — Boyd Dale Sandage, son of Cleveland and Virge Belle Wooden Sandage was born Oct. 4, 1923, on a farm in Harrison co. near Eagleville, Mo. He attended the Christian church near his home and in 1942, graduated from the Eagleville high school. On Feb. 2, 1943, he was inducted into the U.S. Army to serve his country during World War II. He served overseas in southern France, Rhineland and Central Europe where he received several decorations including three Bronze Battle Stars and the Purple Heart Medal. After receiving his honorable discharge on Dec. 26, 1945, he returned to Ia. where his family had moved while he was in the service and helped on the family farm.

On Dec. 28, 1949, he married Eileen Elizabeth Stinn in Avoca. Four children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Fiscus in Polk twp., moving to their present farm in 1951. After Mrs Sandage died on May 15, 1971, he continued to make his home there. He died at his home on Wednesday, March 3, 1982 at the age of 58 years.

In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by his father, Cleveland Sandage. He is survived by his mother, Mrs Virge Belle Sandage of Woodbine; one son, Roy Dale Sandage of Walnut; three daughters, Sharon Ann (Mrs John) Henderson of Eagle, Neb.; Linda Marie Sandage of Kimballton and Thresa Lynn Sandage of Co. Bluffs; two grandchildren; three brothers, Lloyd Sandage of Omaha, Richard San-

dage of Scranton and Dean Sandage of Dunlap; three sisters, Alberta (Mrs Gene) Merrat of Jacksonville, Fla., Yvonne (Mrs Gayle) McNelly of Dunlap and Leona (Mrs Horace) Graves of Harlan; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan Saturday, March 6, 1982 with the Rev. Owen E. Wherrett officiating.

Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Eugene Juhl, Howard Wiig, Paul C. Nelson, Lehman Swensen, Allyn Bartelson and Lyle Christoffersen serving as casketbearers.
