

THE LIFE STORY OF — **Max Sander**

ELK HORN — Max Sander, son of Emil and Katie Moller Sander, was born Nov. 10, 1915 in Manning. On Jan. 22, 1936 he married Evelene Lengeman in Manilla. They lived in Manning and Exira before coming to Elk Horn 33 years ago. He was employed at produce stations here, 30 years, with Elk Horn Brand Eggs. He served his country during WW II, and was stationed in Yokohama, Japan with the postal dept. He was baptised and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. Max died at Veterans hospital in Omaha, Nebr., on Oct. 22, 1976 at age 60 years, 11 months and 12 days.

He was preceded in death by his father, three brothers and two grandchildren. Survivors include his wife and mother - Katie Sander, Salem Nursing Home, two brothers - Herman Sander of Moundsville, Mo., and Louie Sander of Eureka, Kans., a daughter - Mrs Dean (Cathy) Koster of Harlan and five grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the Elk Horn Lutheran church on Monday, Oct. 25, 1976 with Pastor Eugene Soland, officiating. Burial was in the Elk Horn cemetery with Lynn Larsen, Donald Wiges, Dick Olsen, Lester Esbeck, Delbert Rasmussen and Burdette Poldberg serving as casket-bearers. Military rites were conducted by E. H. Post of the American Legion.
