Arthur Harrison Saveriede, "Bush," son of Lars H. and Mary Olson Saveriede, was born at Story City, on Sept. 13, 1894. He attended school in Story City until age 13, when he moved with his parents to Harlan. He grew to adulthood in Harlan and after graduating from the Harlan high school in 1915, attended business school in Harlan. Arthur then enlisted and served his country during WWI. After receiving his honorable discharge in Nov. of 1918, he returned to Harlan.

On April 14, 1922, he married Sarah Luella Comstock at Harlan. Four daughters were born to this union. They made their home in Harlan. They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in April of 1972. Arthur worked at the Shelby County State Bank and later the Shelby County Abstract office. On Oct. 6, 1938, he was admitted to the Iowa Bar Assn.

and has practiced law in Harlan since that time. He was past mayor of Harlan, had served as city attorney, and also served as Justice of the Peace for a number of years. He was a member of the Harlan Volunteer Fire Department. He had the honor of being selected as a Man of the Years in Harlan in 1970.
