

THE LIFE STORY OF —

MRS WILLIAM J. SCHULTE, 83

EARLING — Anna Mary Schulte, daughter of Joseph and Rosalia Zimmerman Rosenthal, was born Oct. 3, 1890 in Westphalia, where she attended school and grew to adulthood. She died at the Little Flower Haven in Earling, on April 1, 1974 at age 83 years, 5 months and 28 days. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Boniface church in Westphalia and she has been a member of St. Joseph's church in Earling since moving here. She was also a member of St. Joseph's Altar Society. On Sept. 7, 1915 she married William J. Schulte at St. Boniface church in Westphalia. Mr and Mrs Schulte operated the General Store in Westphalia until 1937. They then moved to Earling where Mr Schulte had a produce business. Mr Schulte died on Feb. 7, 1958 and Mrs Schulte continued to make her home in Earling after his death. In September of 1972 she became a resident

of the Little Flower Haven in Earling.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by two sons - Lawrence and Raymond; her parents; two brothers - John and Joseph Rosenthal; and three sisters - Mrs Josephine Schulte, Minnie and Rose Rosenthal. Mrs Schulte is survived by eight daughters - Frances (Mrs Lee Irwin) of Harlan, Josephine (Mrs Ray Kwapiszeski) of Panama, Ellen (Mrs Joe Stoll) of Chandler, Ariz., Helen (Mrs Ray Carey) of The Dalles, Oreg., Alice (Mrs Phil Carey) of Panama, Bernice (Mrs Leo Feser) of Defiance, Theresa (Mrs Cecil Blum) of Walnut and Agnes (Mrs Leo Gaul) of Earling; by three sons - John Schulte of Earling, Howard Schulte of Harlan, and Paul Schulte of Carroll; by 42 grandchildren; and 19 great grandchildren, by one brother - Ed Rosenthal of Portsmouth; by one sister - Mary (Mrs John Langenfeld) of Westphalia; by her nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Joseph's church in Earling on Thursday, April 4, 1974 with Rev. Duane Weiland as celebrant. The Very Rev. Msgr. Michael W. Schwarte, Revs. Anthony Palmer, Ed Kelly, Fred Reischl, Eugene Koch and Robert Chamberlain were concelebrants. Burial was at St. Boniface cemetery in Westphalia with Dale Feser, Patrick Carey, William Schulte, Michael Carey, Gary Blum, and Tim Gaul, her grandsons, serving as pallbearers. Acoyltes were four grandsons, Greg Gaul, John Schulte, Duane Schulte and Ricky Blum.
