Defiance — John William Schulte, son of William and Anna Rosenthal Schulte, was born in Westphalia on April 3, 1917. He was baptized and confirmed in the St. Boniface high school in 1935. He spent two years following his graduation at Dowling in Des Moines. Following his two years in Des Moines, Mr Schulte worked for his father, operating the creamery in Earling. Then he worked at the Heese Lumber Yard in Earling.

Mr Schulte was a Ship's Cook in the Navy. After his discharge in 1945, he worked again at the creamery in Earling. He then worked at the Purina Feed Service, and following that, he worked at the County Engineers Office for 16 years. Mr Schulte retired in 1976 because of ill health.

He married Dorothy Henz on Sept. 15, 1944. Then on Nov. 22, 1948, he married Edna Gollobit in Sacred Heart church in Manilla. Seven children were born to this union. He was a past member of the American Legion, Post No. 615, of Earling, and a member of St. Joseph's church in Earling. Mr Schulte died at the Little Flower Haven Nursing Home in Earling, on Wednesday, June 11, 1980, at age 63 years, 2 months and 8 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his first wife; one daughter, Mary Ann; one sister, Ellen Stoll; and two brothers, Lawrence and Raymond.
