Westphalia — Hilda Mary Scott, daughter of Michael and Catherine Schneider Musich, was born on a farm in Shelby county near Portsmouth on Feb. 26, 1916. She was baptized at St. Mary's church in Portsmouth. As a small girl, she moved with her parents to a farm near Westphalia, and was confirmed at St. Boniface church in Westphalia.
