

Edwin A. Sick, 51

Edwin Alfred Sick, son of Alfred and Freda Schmidt Sick, was born June 6, 1930 in Harlan. He was baptized at the Lutheran church in Avoca, and attended the country school near Avoca. After graduating from Shelby high school in 1949, he farmed with his dad. On Jan. 21, 1952, he was inducted into the U.S. Army as a Private First Class and later promoted to Corporal to serve his country during the Korean conflict until receiving an honorary discharge on Jan. 5, 1954. He then returned to Shelby to continue farming with his dad until 1957, when he moved into Shelby where he was engaged in farming and truck driving.

He was a member of the American Legion, Post No. 240 in Shelby.

He died at Mercy hospital in Co. Bluffs, on July 9, 1981, at age 51 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Alfred and Freda, and is survived by his three brothers, Wilbert of Shelby, Melvin of Ft. Dodge, and Alfred Jr. of Atlantic; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Sunday, July 12, 1981 with the Rev. Hugh Drennan, Minister of the Presbyterian church in Shelby, officiating.

Burial was in the Minden cemetery at Minden with David Paul, Ronald Kiesel and H.P. Jorgensen, Jr. serving as honorary pallbearers and Wade Sick, David Sick, Roger F. Paul, Donald Jensen, Keith Peterson and Russell Redinbaugh serving as casketbearers.

Military rites were conducted at the cemetery by the American Legion Post No. 240 in Shelby.
