



Marcella I. Stolz, 70

Harlan — Marcella Irene Stolz, daughter of Joseph and Susan Mumm Scheuring, was born on a farm in Shelby county near Defiance, on Aug. 30, 1908. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Peter's church in Defiance.

She attended country school and later St. Paul's school in Defiance. She then attended the public high school in Defiance for three years and completed her senior year at the Catholic high school in Cherokee. Marcella then taught in rural schools near Defiance for several years. On May 20, 1940 she married Melvin Stolz at St. Peter's church in Defiance. They made their home on a farm near Boone until Aug. of 1978 when they moved to Harlan. This has been their home since that time.

Mrs Stolz died at Myrtue Memorial hospital on Thursday, Aug. 9, 1979 at age 70 years, 11 months and 9 days. She was a member of St. Michael's church and St. Michael's Guild in Harlan.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by two sisters — Celia Scheuring and Carmen Kenkel. Her survivors include her husband, Melvin, of Harlan; three brothers — Valentine Scheuring of Carroll and Austin and Vernon Scheuring, both of Defiance; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

A Concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Michael's church in Harlan on Monday, Aug. 13, 1979, with Rev. Richard G. Wagner as celebrant and Rev. Louis Scheuring, Rev. Edward Scheuring and Rev. Tom Nash as concelebrants. Burial was in St. Peter's cemetery, Defiance, with Louis Stolz, George Stolz, Merrill Stolz, Austin Scheuring, Vernon Scheuring and Valentine Scheuring serving as pallbearers.
