



THE LIFE STORY OF —

Edward Sullivan, 66

PANAMA — Edward E. Sullivan, son of Eugene and Mary Ann Lehan was born Aug. 16, 1910 in Panama. He died in the hospital in Redonda Beach, Calif., on May 13, 1977 at age 66 years, 8 months and 28 days. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's church, Panama, and graduated from St. Mary's high school. He then went on to a year at St. Benedict's college, Atchison, Kans. He attended a business school in Omaha for two years and attended Creighton University in Omaha. He then went to Des Moines. Mr Sullivan and Genevieve Malm were married at St. John's church in Des Moines on Sept. 21, 1940. This union was blessed with two daughters, Virginia Lupescu of Rossmoor, Calif., and Susan Laipple of Garden Grove, Calif. They lived in Des Moines for nine years, and then were transferred to Wheaton, Ill., where he worked for 24 years. Mr Sullivan worked for Dun and Bradstreet, the Chicago office, for 33 years, where he held an executive position. He and his wife then retired to Garden Grove, Calif., where they made their home until his death.

Preceding him in death were his parents and an older brother, Robert. He is survived by his wife Genevieve, his two daughters, his sister, Bessie, who resides in Panama, and three grandchildren, Edward and Jenna Laipple and Erik Lupescu.

A requiem Mass was celebrated May 16, 1977 in St. Columban's church, Garden Grove, Calif., with Father Daniel Murray, officiating. Burial was in Holy Sepulcher cemetery, Orange, Calif., with Richard Laipple, Edward Laipple, Glen Lupescu, Michael Bruning, Glen Bruning, Marc Thompson and Steve Prestin as pallbearers.
