

The Life Story of—

Ralph Sunderman, 77

Walnut - Ralph O. Sunderman, son of Charles and Ida Julie Kaiser Sunderman was born June 27, 1899 southwest of Lyman, and grew to manhood in this area. Later he moved near Atlantic, then moved to the Elmer Juhl farm south of Walnut where he worked and lived for 13 years. The past six years he lived at Peace Haven Home in Walnut. Mr Sunderman served in the army during WWII and was a member of Walnut Amvets Post No 45 and Walnut American Legion Post No 422. He took an active part in fund raising for two organizations, and his favorite project was selling tickets for the Amvet Fun Days. He died Jan. 10, 1976 at Cass County Memorial hospital at age 77 years.

He is survived by four brothers Joe and Werner of Griswold, Ray of Cedar Rapids, Rev Hubert Sunderman of Port Huren, Mich., nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Sam.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, Jan. 13, 1976 at the Roland Funeral Home in Atlantic, with Orris Drake, Administrator of Peace Haven Home, officiating. Casketbearers were Sherwood Sunderman, Werner Sunderman, Jr., Elmer Juhl, Edwin Sunderman, Darrell Sunderman and Ernest Kreis. Burial was in Noble Center Cemetery, south of Lyman. Military services at the graveside were conducted by Walnut Amvets and Walnut American Legion.
